Happy Fall Y'all!

We will be working on following directions the 1st time in our school as part of the school wide behavior goal this month. Ask your child about how they follow directions the 1st time at school!


In literacy we are continuing our study of non-fiction texts and writing about animal

# **October is Bullying Prevention Month!**

- Is it Bullying? What is it?
  - Teasing
    - Everyone is having fun
    - No one is getting hurt
    - Everyone is participating equally
  - Conflict
    - No one is having fun
    - There is a possible solution to the disagreement
    - Equal balance of power
  - Mean Moment
    - Someone is being hurt on purpose
    - Reaction to a strong feeling or emotion
    - An isolated event that does not happen regularly
  - Bullying
    - Attacked physically, socially, or emotionally
    - Unequal balance of power
    - Happens more than once over a period of time
    - Someone is being hurt on purpose





October is National Bullying Prevention Month! To help our school be a safe and respectful place, we are going to use the *Second Step* Bullying Prevention Unit. In the lessons, your child will learn specific skills to help stop bullying. Students will learn how to:

- **Recognize** when bullying is happening
- **Report** bullying to a caring adult
- Refuse to let bullying happen to themselves or others
- Be a bystander who stands up and is part of the solution to bullying
- Fourth and Fifth Grade will also learn how to Recognize, Refuse, and Report cyber bullying when they see or know about it happening

And we need your help, too! Get involved in making our school a safe and respectful place by letting us know if you hear about bullying at our school. Make sure your child knows to tell you or someone at school if he or she is being bullied. And give your child the clear message that it is never okay to bully others.

### Who We Are

Mrs. Snyder supports all children in reaching their academic potential mainly by teaching and fostering healthy Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) skills. Some of the things Mrs. Snyder does:

- Teaches SEL lessons in all classrooms. Topics include self-awareness, self-management, social awareness, responsible decision making, and relationship skills.
- Provides small SEL groups
- Short-term individual counseling for topics, such as grief, friendship, emotion regulation and family change. If ongoing services are needed, Mrs. Snyder can provide the family with community counseling resources.
- Crisis support and intervention.
