Greetings Downsville Families,

For PBIS this month we are focusing on **being respectful**. This includes being respectful to self, peers, grown ups, and property. It has been a snowy winter! We have had so many weather closures, that any additional closures will need to be remote learning days for Downsville Elementary. You may have already heard from your classroom teachers and seen a **remote learning packet** of materials in their folder. In the event of any closures, we will send a communication and the expectation will be for students to complete this packet. It can just stay in the folder until it's needed. Students should work on it if we are closed and turn it in to their teacher the next day. The activities are designed to be completed mostly independently, and not include new material. Third Grade

We have been working hard and efficiently in Third Grade! We started learning about fractions in math and have been playing a few new math games to help us practice our fractions! In Literacy, we have started Unit 6, with the essential question being about making decisions. We have been able to use the knowledge we already have to create great discussions during our Literacy time as we learn through different activities and lessons. Social Studies has been a blast as we have been reading about landforms and what kind of landforms we see around our state and what we see in other states. It is so exciting to compare and contrast our own state to others around us and build our knowledge! Students also recently enjoyed the Valentine's Day Party by handing out their Valentines to classmates while enjoying a sweet treat! It was such a positive activity that all of the students were able to participate and share together. The snow and ice rink have been a blast these past months with being able to skate with the High School boys hockey players, but I think my students and myself are excited for warmer weather!











Students in fourth grade have just wrapped up their battle of the books competition. ur Peaceful Pineapple group of Brailey, Karl, Saidie, and Izzy competed in the state battle and we are now excitedly awaiting the results.

The fourth graders are learning about fractions in math. The can find equivalent fractions, add and subtract fractions, and multiply a whole number times a fraction. They can also change an improper fraction into a mixed number.

In literacy we are reading stories about Challenges. We read President Reagan's union address after the space shuttle challenger disaster and learning how he encouraged our nation not to give up on new explorations just because tragedy struck during the challenger launch.

In social studies we are learning about Wisconsin history. Swe learned how the fur trade was the first business in Wisconsin.We are looking forward to go to the Mabel Tainter in April to see Les Fils du Voyageurs (The Sons of The Voyageurs) Les Fils du Voyageurs is a male vocal group consisting of seven members singing and recreating, while dressed in authentic costume of the period, an historical recount of the French fur trade era of the 1600's through the 1840's.

Our Literacy has us beginning an opinion essay about a technology of their choice and learning about technology innovations that affected the Industrial Revolution.


And the month of February we got to work with our buddies twice!

Can't wait to see what the month of March brings us!


Counselor News

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


MUSIC NOTES!


For the 4th grade members we will be working to design an all school assembly with each student contributing with either a poster, poem reading, or part in a reading skit.

Art News








Student art has been hung at the CVTC building in Menomonie for the district Spring Art Show.





