Kindergarten: Hi Families,

The Kindergarten class was busy during the month of October. We finished our 1st Math module where we learned about numbers 1-10. We learned how to name, recognize and write the numbers. We also practiced counting and learned the partners (ie...5 is 1 + 4, 2 + 3, and 0+ 5) of each number. We will continue to practice what we learned in Module 1 and start our 2nd module on Shapes in November. In Reading, we practiced being Storybook Readers! We listened to, reread, and acted out many favorite stories. Some of our favorites to read and act out were Caps For Sale, Goldilocks and the Three Bears, The Three Little Pigs, and The Gingerbread Man. We also loved the "David books". In phonics, we became experts at many letters. We learned the name, and sound of each letter and made mini books with pictures to match the letter sounds. We also practiced taking each letter "to the street" (lined paper) and forming the letters correctly. Our brains are on fire in Kindergarten!

Third graders have been working hard this fall! We just began a new reading unit focused on nonfiction books which fits with our informational writing unit.

Students continue to learn multiplication facts and different ways to measure- time, weight, volume.

Fourth Grade: The fourth graders were sad to say goodbye to our student teacher Miss White last week. We were very lucky to have her with us for the last 9 weeks. Soon we will be getting a new addition to our class, Mrs. Anderson has adopted a virtual class cow for us. We are anxiously awaiting news about the farm our calf lives on and the name of our new class calf.

The fourth graders have been working really hard and learning lots of new things. They have begun their Battle of the Books reading. They are trying to read 20 different books by February! They have also been digging deep into learning about characters both as readers and writers. They have been looking closely at characters as they read their books. They created character puppets to show that they got to know both the inside and outside of their characters. They used what they knew about good characters to create their own characters and wrote several of their own stories. Next, we will be learning about being good nonfiction readers and writers.

In math, we have completed our first two units. We have become very good at adding and subtracting multi-digit numbers, rounding, and converting metric units. We have just started our big unit on multiplication and division. We are excited to learn how to multiply two-digit by two-digit numbers. But first, we are working hard to find patterns and to learn different strategies to figure out our math facts.

In social studies and science, we are learning about different landforms and how land changes over time. We solved the mystery of how the Ashfall fossil beds in Nebraska were buried so deep and took so many years for scientists to discover. We have also researched and presented information about the 5 different regions of Wisconsin.

It is amazing how many new things we can learn and discover in 9 short weeks!



Fifth Grade: We've been doing many exciting projects and lessons in fifth grade. In addition to the normal reading, writing, and math the students are familiar with, they have done activities that are new to Downsville. One such activity that the students really enjoy is Tree Journaling. Once a month the kids go out and visit their "tree buddies." They write about what they are observing and draw a sketch of the tree. It is a great way for them to work on their writing skills and get outside in nature.



PTC secretary's report October 19, 2020 - via GOOGLE MEETS

Attendees: Tawny Nelson, Keila Drout, Jennifer Sol, Tammy Christianson, Julie Fiege, Michelle Lablonde, Candace Moore, Lexi Marsh

Call to order: Lexi called the meeting to order at 5 PM.

Secretary's report: Jen motioned to approve the secretary's report, Julie seconded.

Treasurer's report: Jen motioned to approve the treasurer's report, Michelle seconded.

Old business: The new budget was approved.

The staff appreciated the food for conferences, the food that was ordered in worked well.

We discussed the possibility of having a fundraiser this year. Staff is worried that families may already be struggling financially. Staff is also concerned that they already have a lot of extra duties this year (cleaning, and other covid related responsibilities). Staff felt maybe waiting until spring would be better. Staff thought that since we will not have a lot of the same opportunities this year we may not need as large of a budget. Sara Holcombe also shared that the student council has a budget and is willing to help with expenses. We will be tabling the idea of a fundraiser until closer to spring break.

New business: We have Scholastic dollars that we need to spend soon. We were unable to host a book fair last spring and again this fall. Teachers are able to send home book orders from Scholastic and families can order books through the teachers. We discussed hosting an online book fair, Tammy shared that families at Downsville did not use the E-wallet available last year and we feel families would not be interested in an online book fair. Tammy made a motion for teaching staff to have access to the funds to purchase books, Candace seconded.

The parent survey results are in. We received 4 responses. Most responses wanted to keep with Monday nights at 5:30pm. We will continue to keep with the day and time, staying with the 3rd Monday of the month and keeping meetings virtual for now. We may not need to have a meeting each month as we currently do not have as many events to discuss. Right now we do not see a need to hold a meeting in November. Keila mentioned that we should try to hold a meeting most months so that the dedicated group remains. Tammy motioned that we should wait until December 21st to hold the next meeting, Lexit seconded the motion.

Principal's report: Keila thanked PTC for all the support at school. Food for conferences, Downsville clothing, ect. Julie also shared that kids are doing amazing at school, especially with all the new routines that are in place. Lexi did let Keila know that if she does need anything from PTC we are willing to help!

Meeting adjourned: Tammy motioned to adjourn, Jen seconded the motion at 6:09.


